| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Interest in developing the skills and competencies to provide reflective supervision/consultation | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must be able to attend a training on FAN foundations in Bend area Sept. 14, 15, and 16, 2026 (travel, lodging, training, paid by fellowship) |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must be able to attend a virtual training DC05 for two half days in Oct. or Nov. 2026 (dates to be determined. Input will be gathered from fellows when finalizing dates). | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• First preference to applicants who live or work in rural Oregon (but encourage all interested applicants to apply!) |
- First preference to applicants who are diagnosticians or contribute to diagnostic processes and are interested in DC:05 training (e.g., nurse practitioners, physicians, license eligible clinicians such as licensed counselors/LPCs, psychologists, social workers, occupational therapists, etc.). (but encourage all interested applicants to apply!)

* Fellows will receive IECMH foundations trainings (i.e., FAN, DC05, Zero to Three) that include participation in training related activities. In addition, they will receive 90 minutes of RSC per month at a monthly Community of Practice to help complete the portfolio for endorsement in Infant or Early Childhood Mental Health and complete linked activities from the foundations trainings.

* Fellows will become train the trainers of FAN, DC:05, or achieve the reflective supervisor add on for IECMH.
